## NOTES

1. MATH 113 or HNRS 125 fulfills the quantitative reasoning requirement for the Honors College. Math 113 requires a placement exam. See the Math Department for exam days and times.
2. ASTR 111/112, BIOL 103, CHEM 103, GEOL 101, PHYS 103 or 243/244 will substitute for HNRS 227
3. The Global Affairs language requirement for all catalog years is 18 credits. If you have taken language courses number 101-202, you need intermediate proficiency (202) plus 6 more credits of any foreign language coursework. If you have taken courses numbered 110-210, you need intermediate proficiency (210), plus 9 more credits of any foreign language coursework. Waivers and exams do count towards language proficiency.
